Just recently it was vehicle insurance renewal time and an agent (the agent I had since day one with this company had left within the last six months, I think his conscience got the better of him) went over the policy with me. The policy had increased 3.7 %. some parts went up, others went down, she offered a clause (with extra cost) that covers the cost of a rental vehicle if my vehicle is in the body shop. I questioned, doesn't the collision coverage cover this? No was the answer. Now I understand that the firms have always offered rental car insurance at an extra charge, as long as you had collision coverage, but now you need it to cover what they used to cover in the policy, very sneaky. Years ago Consumer Union, in a vehicle insurance article stated, if your vehicle is over 10 years old, having collision coverage isn't worth the cost, (let's bump that up to 15 years to cover the insane autobody costs of today). If you have collision just to cover up your bad driving habits, the company will jack up your collision coverage so much, you wouldn't be able to afford it!!

So I was glad I had her go over the policy with me, by just looking through your policy paperwork you would be none the wiser of what they cover or in many cases, do not cover. They say insurance is 'peace of mind' but you would lose your 'mind' if you found out too late what your coverage no longer covered. B

This year, Nationally we received 168 applications of which 42 were rejected for various reasons under the rules. Disgualifications due to:

- No resume submitted (14)
- Missing or incomplete marks (10)
- Applicants sponsor not a CNPA Contributing Member (9)
- Unacceptable proof of registration

CRITERIA

- -Applications are accepted from children, grandchildren, great grandchildren (includes legally adopted and stepchildren and step grandchildren) of CNPA Contributing Members.
- -Minimum 80% grade average over the most recent 2 full academic school years to qualify.
- -Applicants must be a full-time student enrolled and attending a Canadian or United States accredited University or College.
- -Applications will only be accepted from April 15th to August 15th.

SCORING

60% Based on the Average mark from last 2 Years 15% of overall Community Involvement 10% of overall Personal achievement 10% of overall Academic Participation 5% Other - goals, initiative, special situations

Jasper Wildfire Relief

We contributed to the CN Employees' and Pensioners' Community Fund to benefit the Canadian Red Cross 2024 Alberta Wildfires Appeal in time to receive marching amounts from CN, the Government of Canada and the Government of Alberta. That meant that for every dollar we donated, \$6 was donated to the Appeal.

Hockey Helps the Homeless

CN signed on as the Premier National Partner with the Hockey Helps the Homeless (HHTH) program for three years, starting in 2024. This program consists of organizing and holding hockey tournaments in locations across Canada and where available, they include NHL, AHL (etc) alumni, local teams and, if there is sufficient interest, a CN team of active employees.

The tournaments run approximately the same time period as the NHL season. For each tournament, the organizing committee could use between 10-15 volunteers.

For 2024, Calgary was chosen to host a tournament on November 1.

Of course, I was not contacted prior to this being announced to me. When I asked at our regular meetings, there were no volunteers. If any of you wish to volunteer, please let me know as soon as possible and I will direct you to how you have to register and be informed of the various positions available to choose from. Shifts begin at 07:00 and the tournament ends at 17:00. I believe a meal is planned for the volunteers after that time. Note this is also a fundraiser but "fundraising for volunteers is not a requirement".
