

Q...I have just retired from CN after 35 years of service. Am I not automatically a member of the CN Pensioners Association?

A...Yes, you are certainly a recognized member of the association; however, we have **two types of membership:** (1) contributing and (2) non-contributing. Most community or non-profit organizations have a dues structure whereby dues payments are mandatory. We are a non-profit volunteer based organization consisting of more than 32,000 pensioners and survivors and because we are a democratic association, we do not force members to contribute financially, although, like any service organization, the CNPA does require operating funds to conduct the business necessary for it to function successfully.

Q...I am on "bridging". Can I become a contributing member of the CNPA? **A...**Absolutely! We welcome you as a contributing member of CNPA. It is important for you to note, however, that until you reach retirement age, you have to pay your annual membership fee by cheque or money order, as your monthly pay cheque does not come from the same fund as pensioners. However, the good news is that once you reach retirement age, you can switch over to payroll deduction.

Q...Are spouses of pensioners automatically members?

A...Spouses are NOT considered members unless the Dues Fee has been paid for them. If anyone wants their spouse to be a member, we can increase their Payroll Deduction to \$2.00. When a pensioner passes away, the spouse will be sent an application for membership so she/he will have the option to become a contributing member. Nothing is automatic.

Q...I am a surviving spouse of a CN pensioner. Can I also become a contributing member of the CNPA?

A...YES, as a surviving spouse you are an important part of the CN pensioner population and we welcome your application to become a contributing member. The CNPA is there to protect the interests of both pensioners and survivors.

Did you know?

When a contributing member of our association dies, the surviving spouse is welcomed to our dinner meetings (when we have meetings) at no charge for a full year?

IMPORTANT...

When a pensioner changes address, a person becomes a new pensioner (retiree or surviving spouse), or a pensioner dies, **CN Pension and Benefits Administration** must be advised (**1-800-361-0739**). A surviving spouse does **not** automatically remain a member of the CN Pensioners Association. To remain a member of the Belleville Council, the surviving spouse must complete a new membership application and arrange their own payment of dues (\$1.00 per month).

Please read all the instructions, terms and conditions and submission requirements carefully before emailing your submissions as these have been updated. Incomplete submissions will be rejected. Please ensure you use the current application form as it has changed from previous years. Applicants must have a minimum 80% average over the most recent 2 full school years in order to be considered. The results of the Program will be communicated to applicants by September 7th, 2022.
